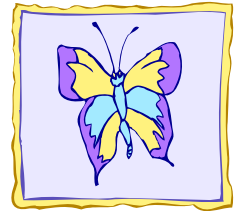
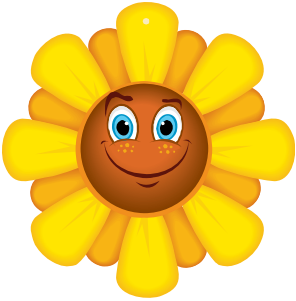

# The Pastor's Page

*Don't be harsh or impatient with an older man. Talk to him as you would your own father...Reverently honor an older woman as you would your mother...you should pay back with gratitude some of what you have received"(1 Timothy 5:1,2).*

I am acutely aware that we worship in and carry out the work and word of God in an aging building. There are times when I see something that needs to be tended to and I think of the movie, "The Money Pit." Over the years money has been spent to repair and replace a major part of our heating system. We borrowed money to correct a water problem that caused a lot of damage to Fellowship Hall. The boiler needs additional work. We have a lead issue that will be corrected this summer. The two round windows in the attic of Spellman Hall need to be replaced (water damage). Our Board of Trustees is faced with yet one more major improvement that cannot be put off to another time.

The Finance Committee has prepared a budget from our committees and boards that will allow us to continue our mission and work for another fiscal year. The church relies on the Covenants we make with one another and God to support the staff, music program and Christian education, and maintain our buildings and grounds as well. This Covenant we make is vital to God, and to the church, and continues year after year.

We worship and meet and engage in fellowship in a building that does not provide physical access to all. An ad hoc committee has begun the task of exploring elevators and lift-a-vators; how much will it cost and where will we build one? This is important to who we are as a church and how we provide access to all our members, friends, visitors, and people in the community who need a place to meet.

I look at the big picture and I see how overwhelming it could be. The tendency might be to walk away from the church and let someone else who has the money contend with it. Or, put aside the repairs and replacements until we can afford them. Or, forget about the elevator. But, is that what God calls us to do?

This morning I thought deeply about these things. I began to think about our church as an aging parishioner. How do we treat our members and friends as we grow old? Do we ignore them? Of course not! We honor them. We do not treat them harshly or without respect. They are the ones who cared for us until we were ready to assume roles of responsibility and leadership here.

I do not think our physical church is any different. It has been the place of weekly worship for half a century. It is the place where we gather for fellowship

and hold our business meetings. Many of you were married here, or have parents or other relatives who were married in the sanctuary. Over the decades, so many babies and children have been baptized into the Christian faith here. And, we have said good-bye to many of our forefathers and mothers in celebrations of their lives within these sacred walls.

This aging building needs our respect and care; it needs us to give back in gratitude some of what we received from the past. Today our church offers us more than one opportunity to love her into the future. To do this means we will need to attend the church's Semi-Annual Meeting. The Church Council has moved the meeting from the usual after Sunday worship, to Saturday night June 19, at 5:00 p.m. with dinner. At this meeting the Finance committee will present the proposed budget for 2010-2011, and the Board of Trustees will present its recommendations for replacements and repairs.

This is where our responsibilities as church members become opportunities, not only to love our church into the future, but also to provide a place for our youth, children, and as yet unborn children to grow up in, and become leaders to, in the future.

I pray I will see you June 19 for dinner and...!

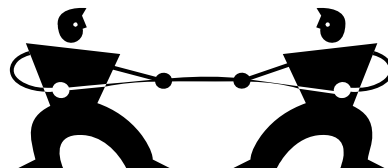
Church Picnic is Sunday, June 6, at 12:30 at Volmar's Grove, following the regular 10 am church service, celebrating Children's Sunday.

The church repair fund was established in 2006 to pay for repairs and improvements to the church building. The fund draws from a line of credit we established with the Naugatuck Savings Bank. On a monthly basis, the church is billed an interest charge for the outstanding balance. In May 2010, the outstanding balance was \$16,321 and the interest charge was \$94.66. This equates to over \$1000. per year of money spent only for interest charges. If future repairs are needed to the building and the congregation decides to use the line of credit to fund these repairs, then the loan balance and the associated interest charges will only increase. We need to pay down the outstanding balance and reduce the monthly interest charges. Please consider gifts or regular donations to pay off the balance of monies borrowed to repair our church. ### Historian's Page

#### PROSPECT CHURCH ASSISTS MISSION WORK IN HAITI

(This is the fourteenth in a series of articles by the Church Historian in order to expand on or, in some cases, to correct narratives told in the 200-year history of the Prospect Congregational Church, *A Church Set Upon a Hill*.)

The devastating earthquake which hit Haiti earlier this year has again propelled the poor island nation into the headlines and brought much needed aid for the stricken people and the damaged infrastructure. Assistance by the Prospect church goes back to the beginning of the pastorate of the Rev. Phyllis Norman, since she and her husband, Carl, have been involved in work with Haiti from the 1990s through the Rhode Island Conference of the UCC. Carl made his first trip to Haiti in 1997 with the Rev. Daehler Hayes, Conference Minister, and others to help build the church at Fontamara, located west of Port au Prince, capital of the country. There they met with Pastor Jean DoRisca, who had founded 62 churches in the country, and they found the people warm and welcoming. For years Phyllis and Carl had supported a young man so that he could continue his education and become a doctor.

In April 2003 Carl returned to Haiti, along with Dan Beach and Mark Cavallaro of the Prospect church and others from Rhode Island in order to help build the Ti Mache church and a school on the second floor over the church. They also brought medicine, clothes and hygiene items and a contribution of \$1,600, which was matched by a foundation in Rhode Island. They also took down wire closet assemblies to set up closets, and they helped put up mosquito netting. Prior to 2003 the church had added a doctor's office and a pharmacy. This trip was followed by a program in Prospect with a visit by the daughter and son of the Haiti pastor, Pastor Alex and Rose from Brooklyn, NY and by the Rev. Daehler Hayes and several people from Rhode Island. There was a Sunday dinner with the traditional rice, beans and chicken, and an opportunity to buy some crafts. Among other things, the Prospect church has raised money to pay for tuition and uniforms so that some children can go to school.

Through the Rhode Island Conference we have learned that the earthquake caused damage to one church building and it had to be rebuilt, but there was no structural damage at Fontamara and no loss of life. This Spring the Prospect church sponsored a dinner to raise money for further aid and relief. Carl has pointed out that there have been no trips since 2003 because of a difficult political situation. Along with our donations, our prayers are with the Haitian people as they try to recover and rebuild after the earthquake.
