Dear family in Christ,

We spend this Lent not only discerning our relationship with God, but discerning the future of this church. As you know, my last Sunday as your Designated Pastor will be March 13th, 2016.

There is good news for you in this transition: you will have the opportunity to work with a new minister, probably another Interim, to address the patterns of conflict that keep repeating throughout the decades. You will have the chance to look at your history, reevaluate your church's mission and strengthen your relationship with the Connecticut Conference and Naugatuck Valley Association. You will have the chance to process the report generated from your Situational Support Consultation. You will have the chance to heal from the experience of the past four months with the help of a new pastor.

And then there is hard news: while our mutual love and affection remain, our professional relationship as pastor and parishioner must come to an end on March 13th. I will no longer be your Pastor. I will no longer be visiting you at home or in the hospital. I will no longer be leading worship or conducting funerals, weddings, or baptisms. The ethical guidelines for clergy insist that I refrain from being present with you or attending any special events for a period of at least one year; this is so you can more easily form a relationship with your new pastor. Although your pastoral search is still ongoing, I have every confidence that the Board of Deacons will soon identify a fine candidate who will lead you through the next part of your interim period.

In the end, the Good News remains: God goes with us, whether we are gathered or scattered. In Christ, we are one body, united, no matter where our journeys lead us. I trust you will continue to pray for me, even as I continue to pray for each of you. Blessed be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love.

I hope to be able to say goodbye to each of you in these next few weeks. In particular, I hope you will join us in worship onMarch 13th, as we say a goodbye to each other that is both sad and joyful.

May God's peace be yours in this season of Lent and always,

- A donation of \$2,000 was made by the Evening Women against the loan principal
- An additional personal gift of \$2,000 was made to the elevator loan principal
- The current status of the elevator loan shows a balance owed of \$86,000 on the principal

Discount Power

The Prospect Congregational Church continues to be a Broker for Discount Power. Discount Power is a discount electricity supplier located in Shelton, CT and has now gone to a policy of only offering fixed rates to their customers.

Recently Discount Power introduced a new fixed rate program for residential customers of \$.0725/kWh for 10 months for new customers and \$.077/kWh for 12 months for existing customers even if you have a contract with them at a higher rate. Currently the Eversource rate is \$.0955/kWh. As you may or may not know, Discount Power supplies only the electricity. Eversource or UI will continue to supply your bill and all service. Discount Power will give the church \$.002 for every kWh used by our customers. This is a WIN/WIN for both the church and our customers.

Whether you are purchasing your electricity from Eversource, UI or another discounted electricity supplier, please check a recent bill to see what rate you are currently paying to determine how much money you can save. Then go to our Discount Power web site at discountpowerinc.com/pccenergy, click on the green get started button and follow their directions. You can also email us at pccuc@snet.net and we will email or call you back to answer any questions you might have. We would also be happy to sign you up if that is what you would like. Also, feel free to speak to us about Discount Power during coffee hour after church on Sundays.
